### Prescott School 2022-23 Calendar (updated)

Dear Prescott Community,

We have an immediate opportunity to help Prescott move one step closer to having a full-sized gym and auditorium!

As you may know, a new Prescott Parents Wolfpack has recently been established to address Prescott's need for a full gym and auditorium. Learn more about our community's vision for this space, and find ways to get involved at **https://prescottparents.com/gym-auditorium-project/**.

Take two minutes to help Prescott move one step closer to this vision: Please tell CPS our students need a new gym and auditorium. The district has just launched a brief survey asking for input on how to spend its capital funding. Please use the tips below to complete the brief CPS 2023 Capital Survey before the deadline on Tuesday, May 9 at http://www.cps.edu/capitalsurvey2023. This is a critical opportunity for the Prescott community to voice our students' need for a gym and auditorium.

### Some tips for taking the survey:

- The survey asks you to proportionally assign weight to 5 different categories for funding. While athletic and recreational facilities are not one of these categories, we believe that the "Site Improvements" category best aligns with Prescott's needs. We encourage you to weight these categories based on your preferences, but we also recommend that you put at least some substantial weight on "Site Improvements."
- Question 9 asks, "Do you want to recommend a prioritized list of Capital Needs for a specific CPS school?" Please select "Yes" and answer the remaining questions in support of a gym and auditorium for Prescott.
- Question 12 has a list of capital needs, none of which is a gym. We recommend selecting "Existing Stadium and Pool Facility Renovations" and using Question 15 to further explain. Also, this is an opportunity to identify other needs for Prescott such as Restroom Upgrades, and IT & Security Investments.
- Our rationale for the gym and auditorium is that Prescott's current space is not a full-sized gymnasium and is inadequate for a 21st Century learning environment. PE activities have to be modified, our students cannot play sports such as basketball or volleyball, and we cannot run full-school performances and activities. These are things that should be standard in a K-8 school, and it is Prescott's turn to receive this much-needed investment.

Thank you for helping Prescott move one step closer to the 21st-century learning

environment our students deserve!

Estimada comunidad de Prescott,

¡Tenemos una oportunidad inmediata de ayudar a Prescott a acercarse a tener un gimnasio y un auditorio de tamaño completo!

Como sabrán, recientemente se estableció un nuevo Prescott Parents Wolfpack para abordar la necesidad de Prescott de un gimnasio y un auditorio completos. Tómese dos minutos para ayudar a Prescott a acercarse un paso más a esta visión: Dígale a CPS que nuestros estudiantes necesitan un gimnasio y un auditorio nuevos. El distrito acaba de lanzar una breve encuesta solicitando información sobre cómo gastar sus fondos de capital. Utilice los siguientes consejos para completar la breve Encuesta de capital de CPS 2023 antes de la fecha límite del martes 9 de mayo en http://www.cps.edu/capitalsurvey2023. Esta es una oportunidad crítica para que la comunidad de Prescott exprese la necesidad de nuestros estudiantes de un gimnasio y un auditorio.

Algunos consejos para realizar la encuesta:

- La encuesta le pide que asigne un peso proporcional a 5 categorías diferentes para la financiación. Si bien las instalaciones deportivas y recreativas no son una de estas categorías, creemos que la categoría "Mejoras en la propia escuela" se alinea mejor con las necesidades de Prescott. Lo alentamos a ponderar estas categorías según sus preferencias, pero también le recomendamos que le dé al menos un peso considerable a las "Mejoras en la propia escuela".
- La pregunta 9 pregunta: "¿Quiere usted recomendar una lista de prioridades de las necesidad de capital para una escuela específica de CPS?" Seleccione "Sí" y responda las preguntas restantes en apoyo de un gimnasio y un auditorio para Prescott.
- La pregunta 12 tiene una lista de necesidades de capital, ninguna de las cuales es un gimnasio. Recomendamos seleccionar "Renovaciones en las instalaciones existentes del estadio y la piscina" y utilizar la Pregunta 15 para obtener una explicación más detallada. Además, esta es una oportunidad para identificar otras necesidades de Prescott, como mejoras de baños e inversiones en tecnología y seguridad.
- Nuestro fundamento para el gimnasio y el auditorio es que el espacio actual de Prescott no es un gimnasio de tamaño completo y es inadecuado para un entorno de aprendizaje del Siglo XXI. Las actividades de educación física deben modificarse, nuestros estudiantes no pueden practicar deportes como el baloncesto o el voleibol, y no podemos realizar actuaciones y actividades para toda la escuela. Estas son cosas que deberían ser estándar en una escuela K-8, y es el turno de Prescott de recibir esta inversión tan necesaria.

¡Gracias por ayudar a Prescott a acercarse al entorno de aprendizaje del Siglo XXI que merecen nuestros estudiantes!

# **Physical Education**

Students in Rooms 203, 304, and 206, have been working on net games during PE. With the focus on hand-eye coordination, students engaged in a game called "sitting volleyball." All rules that apply to regular volleyball apply to this modified game as well. Scrimmage games of volleyball occurred using beach balls and nets, set to three feet. The goal is to not only have students maintain a volley, but also, be mindful of working within a designated space, communication, and display their agility when striking these objects during game play. All groups are also working on sportsmanship and fair play, while self officiating, demonstrating honesty during play. (NASPE Standards 1-5).

# **Prolific Prescott Artists!**

Art Teachers Ms. Ammons and Ms. Bullard nurture art skills, art history knowledge, and studio space for Prescott students to create amazing works. Check out the incredible number of high-quality K-8 artworks by our Prescott students in our online art gallery, and be sure to sign up on Artsonia so your student's work can be included!

Your copy should address 3 key questions: Who am I writing for? (Audience) Why should they care? (Benefit) What do I want them to do here? (Call-to-Action)

Create a great offer by adding words like "free" "personalized" "complimentary" or "customized." A sense of urgency often helps readers take an action, so think about inserting phrases like "for a limited time only" or "only 7 remaining!"

Now that 2nd grade students in room 106 have learned about traditional Japanese art, this week they moved on to learn about contemporary art in Japan. This project was inspired by the work of Yayoi Kusama. Students practiced using the themes of repetition, organic shapes and bold colors common in her artwork, and they were asked to create a series of four drawings with the same motif.


Dear Prescott Families:
