8th Graders: Past, Present and Future Selves

8th graders have been reflecting on and making art based on their experiences as they prepare for the big transition to high school. In these works of art, they have shown three stages of life: past, present and future. Artists including Titian, Munch, Klimt and Gauguin were studied to see how they showed these themes in their work, and students discussed why this theme is common. They then wrote a letter to their future self and a second letter to two peers about school memories they share. They reviewed proportions of the face, and the teacher modeled how to change proportions for a baby or an older person. With

all of this material, the students compiled a collaged drawing. The letters are collaged into the artwork
