Prescott families and friends,

Our 6-8th grade can achieve four levels of autonomy as they work independently or in small groups: Explorer, Surveyor, Navigator, and Pathfinder. Each level gives them more choice about when and where they can sit and move throughout the classroom.

Our middle schoolers weekly reflect on their level of autonomy and plan ways to improve:

- Time management
- Self control
- Organization
- Focus
- Work completion
- Respect.

Similar to our middle schoolers, our Kindergartners have developed extensively the past two years their time management, organization, and work completion through the use of their own management of their menu. I'm excited to see how their higher executive functioning skills translate to stronger learning and social skills in later grades. Ask your child about one of the above areas that they think they do well and ask for examples. Ask them about an area they want to improve and how they plan to do it.

### **Physical Education**

Throughout the school year, students have been working on collaborative activities to develop their teamwork, problem solving, and communication skills to be successful, as well as performance tasks.

This week's photos spotlight Prescott's 7th Grade Students engaged in our bowling unit. All students K-8th experience working with bowling pins and rubber bowling balls. A lifelong sport, bowling is a great way to collaborate with classmates in an engaging and active learning environment. Students learned words such as velocity, strike, spare, pendulum, and foul line to name a few. In addition (no pun intended), students were tasked with calculating their bowling scores manually. For students K-1, the focus was working on rolling the ball and rotating between responsibilities in their lane. Students 2nd-5th used their math skills to add their points using an actual bowling score sheet. Students in 6th-8th learned how to score a strike and a spare accurately, which ties into algebra when solving for a strike (X) and spare (/).

#### **Health Education**

Parents and caregivers can learn about sexual health education (SHE) as well as their children! We encourage parents to attend these **in-person parent education sessions** and **virtual sessions** that will help equip them with the knowledge and skills to talk to their children about sexual health with confidence!

The <u>CDC's Youth Risk Behavior Survey</u> results were recently released. This survey is given every other year to middle and high school students around the country, including Chicago. There was <u>alarming data</u>, but there was also positive information - students who feel connected to their school had more long-lasting protection against poor mental health outcomes. While the report is long, it is worth a read to see what issues our teenagers are facing, especially post-pandemic.
