
6th grade families:

Spider in a Christmas Web by Sohlai Yanez, Grade 7

This is Timothy the Christmas spider. His web is made out of Christmas lights. He likes to eat Christmas cookie crumbs that were left by Santa. Techniques I learned in this watercolor project were a gradient wash, a flat wash, and I practiced making thin lines by holding my brush straight up and down. Advice that I would give is to mix your paint from the palette with water and not just use paint straight out of the palette.



The Nutcracker by Zane Aguirre, Grade 7

My Favorite part of this artwork is how the nutcracker turned out, my least favorite part is where there are some of the dark areas. I did a little but of a transitional wash for the background, I did a gradient wash on an ornament, and I did a flat wash mostly on everything.

Some advice that i would give to someone is to always use the leading edge technique while using watercolor to make it look even.

What inspired me was my experience from preforming in The Nutcracker that my dance school is doing every year.
