- Students will lead their conference
- Teachers will use the grade level form to guide students
- Teachers will allow some time for students to prepare and practice before conference day

As part of our continuous improvement, we will learn and make adjustments to help students learn to reflect on their learning and make goals for their future learning. Student-Led Conferences a regular feature of student learning. For the end of the 2nd Quarter, you can expect your child(ren) to lead one at home with you (without teachers) on December 21st at home. Physical Education

As we enter the last week before Thanksgiving break, I want to wish the Prescott Community a safe and wonderful Thanksgiving holiday. Last week, kindergarten students began the striking unit using balloons as their target. This week, students from 4th Grade Room 306 (Ms. Jasutis) worked on their striking skills by utilizing styrofoam paddles to hit a ball. Starting with controlling their paddle, students used a bean bag to practice their paddle striking and grip before engaging in scrimmage games with classmates. Students then worked on their forehand, backhand, and overhead striking, while continuously

working with teammates in their designated work space, demonstrating understanding of boundaries and spacing while engaged in physical activity (NASPE Standards 1-2, 4).

Health Education

Parents and caregivers can learn about sexual health as well as their children! We encourage parents to attend these in-person parent education sessions and virtual sessions that will help equip them with the knowledge and skills to talk to their children about sexual health with confidence!


