Prescott families and friends,

Our 1st graders have been learning to the engineering iteration process in Ms. Stewart and Ms. Hazelip's classes-- see photos below. In teams of two, our 1st graders learn about tower examples (think Eiffel Tower or Chicago's Water Tower) and how to satisfy two requirements:

- 1. Make it stand on its own
- 2. How tall can you make it.

Teams designed a tower using paper cups, rubber bands, tape, and paper. Then they built their towers and analyzed them for the two requirements above. After this first iteration, 4/10 groups were able to achieve the first requirement and all the towers were fairly short.

Like engineers, our 1st grade teams engaged in a second iteration of design, build, and analysis. 10/10 made their towers stand on their own, and 9/10 made them taller.

Next, the teams will apply the same collaborative design, building, and analysis to bridge-building. This is the kind of constructivist learning going on throughout Prescott School!
